SCONUL and RLUK will be holding a joint Town Hall meeting for members to hear the results and to provide an opportunity to ask questions about the results and to consider next steps. ### Al Evaluative Framework for researchers, and licencing guidance

At <u>SCONUL's May Al coffee morning</u>, James Barnett, Research Skills Advisor, and Lisa Bird, Copyright and Licensing Advisor, at University of Birmingham gave a presentation on frameworks for evaluating Al tools, emphasising the importance of Al literacy for researchers and librarians. During the session they mentioned plans to produce web guidance around support for helping researchers to responsibly select Al tools and to support researchers and librarians with reviewing the terms and conditions of these tools. They have now had approval for their web guidance to be made live: Responsible Al tool selection for researchers – to help a researcher critically assess a tool before using it. Al tools licensing review guidance – a quick review checklist (aimed at researchers evaluating the terms and conditions of a tool), and a full review aimed at supporting anyone formally purchasing an Al tool for a group of users (this could be researchers or eResources/Licencing librarians). The documents have been made available under a CC BY licence to make it easy for others to re-use the materials within their institutions.

The UK Print Book Collection is a national distributed collection of print monographs, securing access to content now and for the future. The success of the UK PBC depends on as many libraries as possible signing up to supporting a national distributed collection of monographs based on a minimum number of 7 retained copies across the member libraries. The full UK PBC launch is planned for this autumn, with further details and resources to be added to the website. ### NHS Wales / WHELF: Open Access Feasibility Study

The Wales Higher Education Libraries Forum (WHELF) and NHS Wales representatives are collaborating to appoint an external consultant to lead a strategic review on the future for health and care Open Access publishing in NHS Wales and Higher Education institutions in Wales. The study has two aims: Identify whether a Diamond Open Press for the publication of medical, health and social care works would support accelerating the shift towards Open Access for NHS and HE institutions in Wales. Take a deep dive into the current publishing practices across NHS Wales' seven Health Boards, three Trusts and two Special Health Authorities and identify whether local or a national Open Access Policy, Institutional Repository and/or Open Press would benefit NHS Wales to increase their research profile. They are considering retiring these two lists since most of the information contained in them is available in their metadata feeds. DOAJ are seeking
