

The SCONUL Summer Conference and AGM 2018 will take place at the Hilton Brighton Metropole Hotel in Brighton.



Caroline Taylor

# University Librarian, University of Leicester and Chair of SCONUL

Caroline has been University Librarian since 2013 when she moved from Nottingham Trent University. Her portfolio at Leicester includes curriculum development, (including student learning), archives, records management and information assurance services.

A significant part of Caroline's professional career has been in public libraries and local government where she worked in Essex, Camden, Westminster, Richmond upon Thames and Oxfordshire, where she was

County Librarian until 2010. With academic library colleagues in the Midlands, Caroline was instrumental in establishing the Mercian Collaboration (a sub group of SCONUL) and was its first chair, before stepping down in 2017 after three years in the role. She is Chair of SCONUL's Workforce Development Task and Finish Group and a trustee of the National Manuscripts Conservation Trust. Caroline's professional interests include library and learning space design, archives and special collections, open scholarship and leadership and management development.



Paul Feldman
Chief Executive, Jisc

Jisc is the UK higher, further education and skills sectors' not-for-profit organisation for digital services and solutions. Paul took up his role in mid-October 2015. Before joining Jisc, he was an executive partner at Gartner UK, a technology research and advisory firm. Paul spent over 20 years in financial services at Nationwide Building Society, Barclays Bank and First Data EMEA, both in IT and business roles. He has also worked in knowledge-based IT organisations including Thomson Reuters Legal UK and the Intellectual Property Office.

Paul has a track record in introducing innovative solutions, was in the vanguard of the first moves to use the internet for commercial purposes and led the work that resulted in same-day payments between bank accounts.





### **Professor Caroline Bassett**

# Professor of Digital Media, University of Sussex and Director, Sussex Humanities Lab

The Sussex Humanities Lab is a multi-disciplinary centre which investigates digital humanities as a method, a practice, and a critical endeavour. Caroline's research explores digital technology and cultural transformation and she has published widely on critical theories of the computational, technology and the everyday, gender and technology, automation and expertise, science fiction and the technological imaginary.

Recent publications include work on artificial intelligence (AI) and the new behaviourism. She is currently writing a monograph exploring anti-computing, and collaborating on a shared project investigating gender and the politics of automation.



### Simon Walker

### Head of Education Development, University of Greenwich

At the University of Greenwich, Simon is responsible for developing university policy and strategy on learning and teaching excellence, and supporting professional development for academic staff. He is a National Teaching Fellow and Principal Fellow of the Higher Education Academy. He established and edits several educational journals and is co-author of the Larnaca Declaration on Learning Design, published in 2016 as a book Learning Design: Conceptualizing a Framework for Teaching and Learning Online.

He is a co-founder of the International Learning Design Cross-Institutional Network, a founding member of the innovative CAMEL project management, and founder of the Academic Practice and Technology (APT) international conference. In 2012, he set up and co-led the Students as Change Agents UK Network which continues to support student engagement across the sector.



### Catherine Nicole Coleman

# Digital Research Architect, Stanford University Libraries and Research Director, Humanities + Design

Nicole works at the intersection of the digital library and digital scholarship as a lead architect in the design and development of practical research services. She is currently leading an initiative within the Library to identify and enact applications of artificial intelligence – machine perception, machine learning, machine reasoning, and language recognition – to make the collections of maps, photographs, manuscripts, data sets and other assets more easily discoverable, accessible, and analysable.

At Humanities + Design she has led the design and development of numerous tools for data visualisation and analysis including Palladio, Breve, and, most recently, Data Pen. The lab encourages and supports collaboration between researchers from the humanities and design to encode interpretive method in tools for data analysis. Lessons learned in that work have proven essential to designing human-centered applications of machine intelligence in support of research.

### Executive Director, SCONUL

Ann Rossiter has been the Executive Director of SCONUL since September 2010. She is a Company Secretary, and serves on a number of external advisory groups, including the Jisc Collections Content Strategy Group and the EThoS Advisory Board. She speaks and writes for SCONUL on the broad range of issues facing libraries.

Ann has spent the majority of her career working in public policy, including as a researcher at the BBC and in Parliament, in consultancy; as director of a think-tank, and as Special Adviser to The Secretary of State, Rt. Hon John Denham MP on higher education policy. She has edited and contributed to a number of books and pamphlets on public policy issues. She is a Fellow of the RSA.

### Alison Johns

### Chief Executive, Advance HE

Alison was appointed Chief Executive of Advance HE in Autumn 2017. Prior to that she was the Chief Executive of the Leadership Foundation and has worked in higher education for 25 years. Before becoming Chief Executive, she was head of policy for leadership, governance and management at HEFCE (now the Office for Students), where she established both the Leadership Foundation and the Equality Challenge Unit.

She is a past president of the Association of University Administrators (AUA) and represents the UK on the Association of Commonwealth

Universities Human Resources Management Network and has recently joined the British Council's planning committee for Going Global, the major international higher education conference.

Alison has extensive international experience of higher education including leading the review of teaching and learning for the Australian government. This led to the establishment of the Office for Learning and Teaching to enhance teaching quality across the Australian higher education sector. Alison regularly takes part in conferences and events, both nationally and internationally, speaking on all aspects of university leadership, governance and management.



### **Dr Rufus Pollock**

# President & Founder, Open Knowledge International and Principal, Datopian

Dr Rufus Pollock is an entrepreneur, researcher and technologist working to make a digital information economy that works for everyone. Founder and President of Open Knowledge, a leading international non-profit organisation that empowers people and organisations with access to information and the tools and skills to use it to make a difference to what they care about.

He is an Ashoka Fellow, a Fellow of the RSA, a recipient of a three-year \$1m Shuttleworth Foundation Fellowship as well as the Mead

Fellowship in Economics at Emmanuel College, University of Cambridge. He has advised national governments, IGOs, companies and NGOs on how to succeed in the digital world. He holds a double first in Mathematics and a PhD in Economics from the University of Cambridge.



### Dr Alexander Grossmann

Founder and President, ScienceOpen and Professor of Publishing Management, University of Applied Sciences (HTWK) Leipzig

Alexander studied Physics at the Technical University Aachen and did his Ph.D. in Physical Chemistry at the Research Center Julich (1996) before he left for a post-doc position in quantum optics at T. Hänsch's group in Munich. Until 2001 he was researcher and Associate Professor in Physics at the University of Tuebingen before he decided to join the publishing industry at Wiley-VCH and Wiley-Blackwell where he was responsible for their international publishing program in Physics until 2007.

Before he got his academic appointment in Leipzig in 2013, Alexander spent five years at Springer and De Gruyter as Managing Director and Vice President Publishing, respectively. In 2013 he co-founded the research platform ScienceOpen.



### **Richard Watson**

Futurist-in-Residence, Technology Foresight Practice, Imperial College London

In addition to his role at Imperial College, Richard is also a lecturer at London Business School and a member of the Civil Aviation Authority's Futures Panel.

Richard has worked with, amongst others, Scottish libraries, Public Libraries New South Wales, Northern Collaboration, Bibliotheekplaza (Netherlands), the Department of Education (Australia and UK) and Cambridge University.

Richard has written five books. His first, *Future Files* (2007), has been translated into sixteen languages. His most recent, *Digital Vs. Human*, explores the areas of artificial intelligence, robotics and the internet from a human perspective.




