As stated in the Association of College and Research Libraries Value of academic libraries report, 'Librarians are increasingly called upon to document and articulate the value of academic and research libraries and their contribution to institutional mission and goals.' The aim of the SCONUL performance portal at http://vamp. diglib.shrivenham.cranfield.ac.uk/, developed and maintained by the SCONUL Working Group on Performance and Quality, is to create and encourage a community of practice in library performance, measurement, assessment and evaluation. The site provides a selection of approaches intended to assist member libraries in demonstrating their value and worth to senior stakeholders within their institutions. The site is designed to be collaborative, allowing users to share their experiences of performance measurement tools within their institution for the benefit of others.

A further aim of the portal is to become recognised as a first port of call in relation to aspects of performance relating to higher education libraries.

Content that has recently been updated includes:

- statistics section providing access to the SCONUL statistics (including main data tables, derived statistics and trend analyses) as well as the last three years of National Student Survey data (2011 data coming soon!)
- quality section providing access to information on the LibQUAL+ survey methodology
  (see www.libqual.org), as well as frameworks
  such as Customer Service Excellence and
  Investors in People, along with information,
  contact details, etc., of sites with experience
  of these areas
- value section, including recently added detail on transparency and costing as well as links to recent selected projects, surveys and reports.

Over the coming months, the group hopes to increase content in the area of EFQM (http://www.efqm.org) and key performance indicators (KPIs). ### **Library Impact Data Project**

This project aims to prove a statistically significant correlation between library usage and student attainment. It builds on research previously undertaken at the University of Huddersfield. By identifying subject areas or courses which exhibit low usage of library resources, service improvements can be targeted. Those subject areas or courses which exhibit high usage of library resources can be used as models of good practice.
